

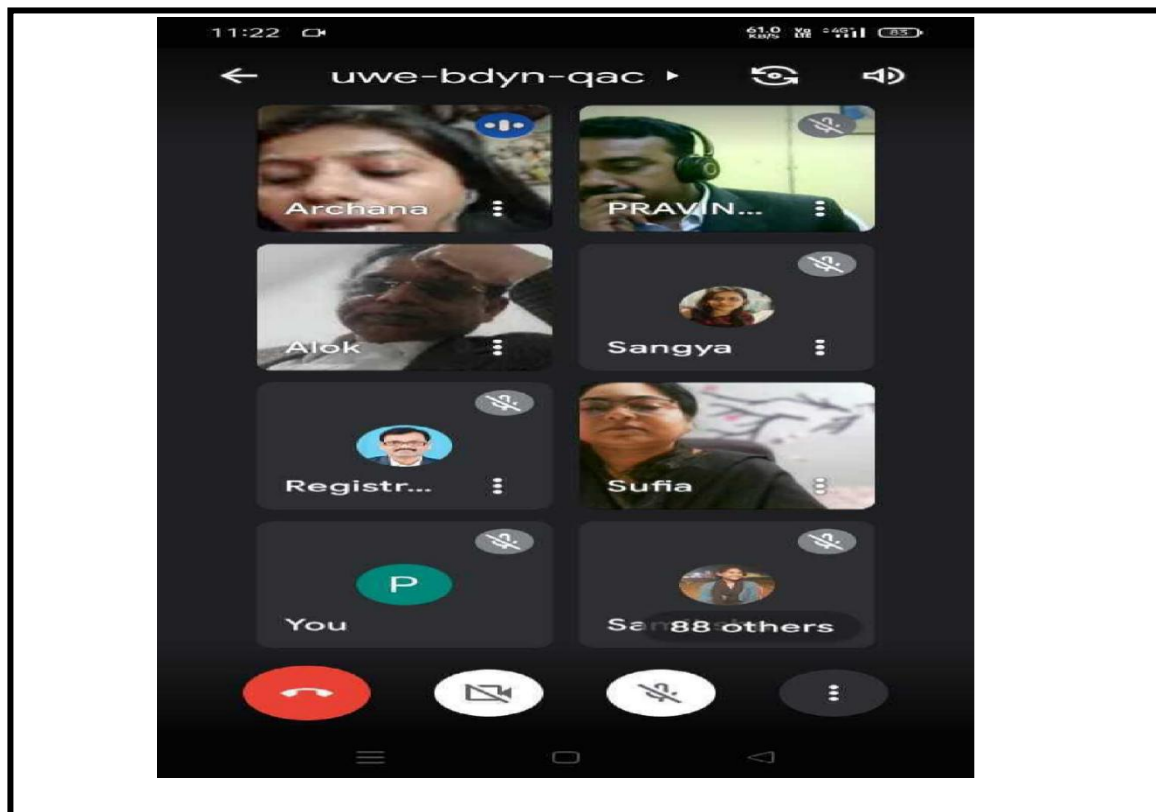

Webinar Picture of Inaugural Session



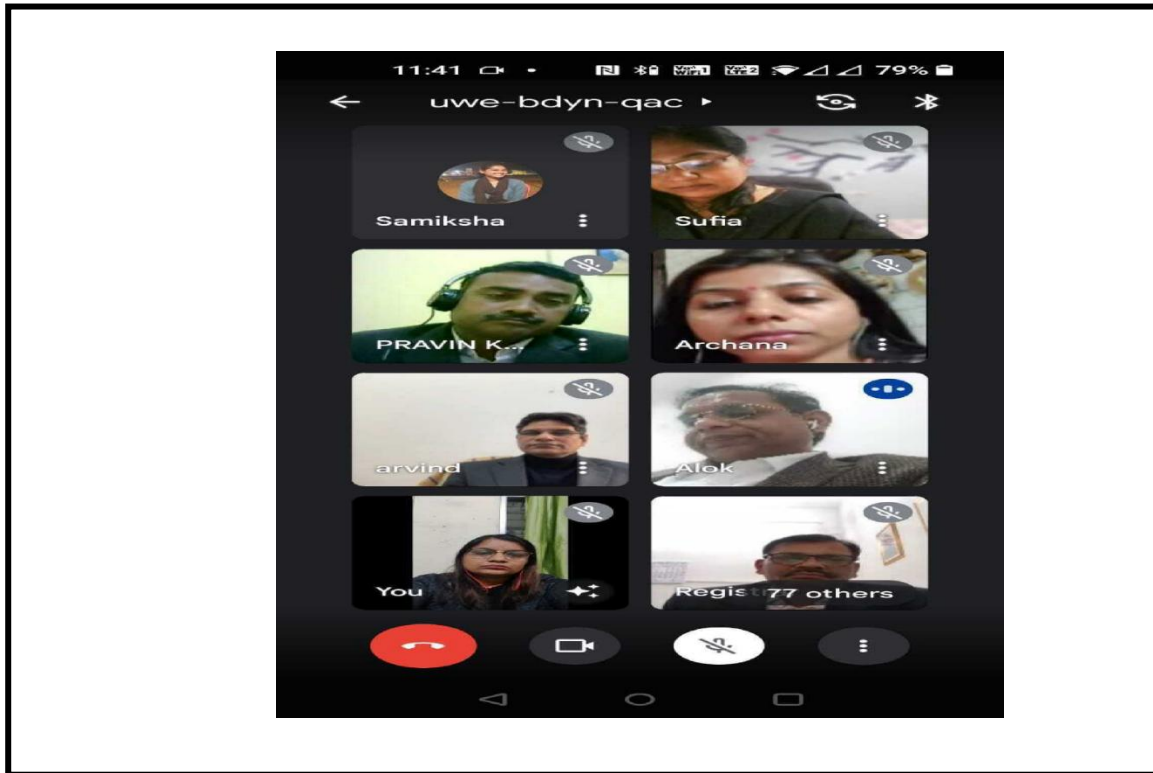

A Brief Abstract of the Event (Maximum 500 Words):

This Webinar was sponsored by National Commission for Women, New Delhi, organized by the Department of Social Work, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya (Central University) Bilaspur (CG) with Dr Archana Yadav as Organizing Secretary and convened by Dr Sangya Tripathi, Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, GGV. The aim of this webinar was to discuss the challenges faced by women in exercising their reproductive rights and postulate relevant findings. A Brief Abstract of the Event (Maximum 500 Words):

A person's temperament or personality traits, factors such as the stability of their upbringing, family life and bonds with family members and factors related to school, such as positive involvement in school activities, as well as community factors, such as the degree of availability of illicit drugs, all influence young people's development, day-to-day lives, relationships with family, friends and peers and self-image.

1. Changes in Family Structures and Values:
