MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE DEANS OF DIFFERENT SCHOOL OF THE STUDIES FOR MAKING CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

A meeting of Deans of different Schools for making an enacting of CBCS curriculum has been held on 19.02.2015 at 3.00 p.m. in the Conference Hall of Administrative Building.

The following Deans of different School of Studies were present in the meeting:

The Deans have gone through the details of UGC guidelines for making Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and also discussed the CBCS pattern running in some Universities in India. The following conclusions have been drawn for making CBCS pattern in Guru Ghasidas University:

- 1. The 3-years (6-semesters) UG programme will have 120 to 135 credits.
- 2. Each semester of 3-years (6-semesters) UG level will have 20 to 25 credits.
- 3. Each PG programme of 2-years (4-semestes) will have 75 to 85 credits.
- 4. Each Semester at PG level 2-years (4-semestes) programme will have 18 to 22 credits.
- 5. The 3-years (6-semesters) PG programme will have 100 to 110 credits.
- 6. Each semester of 3- years (6-semsters) PG programme will have 17 to 20 credits.
- 7. B. P. Ed. programme will have 80 to 100 credits.
- 8. B. Ed. programme will have 80 to 100 credits.

9. M. Ed. programme will have 75 to 85 credits.

- 10. The 4-years Vocational programmes (B. Tech. and B. Pharma.) will have 175 to 200 credits.

 Each semester for these programmes will have 20 to 25 credits.
- 11. B.Sc. Forestry 4-years programme (8-semesters) will have 175 to 200 credits. Each semester for this programme will have 20 to 25 credits.

It has been decided that all the Deans of the School with the help of Head of the Department and Faculty will restructure the Curriculum of the department which comes under his/her School as per above mentioned guidelines. This conversion of syllabus into credit system will have to be completed within 15 days.
