In Compliance of the Gist of observations made by Hon'ble President of India during VC Conference held on 4 and 5th February, 2015 at Rastrapati Bhavan, New Delhi, guideline from MHRD on dated 24th August, 2015 and UGC vide DO No. F.13-13-2015(CU) dated 4/09/2015, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya has adopted 04 tribal dominated Gram Panchayats namely Pudu, Ringwar, Tendubhata and Umariadadar of Kota block, Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh. The adopted villages lie in remotest forest area in a cluster in 45 km from Bilaspur at Ratanpur- Pendra road.

Broad Objective

To develop the adopted Gram Panchayat as **Model Gram Panchayats**.

Other Objectives

1. To develop strong linkages between state government, village community and University.
2. To improve the economic status and living standards of the villagers.
3. To aware and motivate the villagers on health and hygiene
4. To facilitate in bringing and implementation of various governmental programmes/ schemes in selected gram panchayats.
5. To conduct carrier counseling for rural students for higher education and competitive examinations.

Achievements

- The Unnat Bharat Abhiyan team member's visits adopted villages on every Friday to conduct various activities for tribals and other villagers.
- The inclusion of name of all the adopted villages was done by the effort of UBA team for implementation of Swaksha Bharat Mission programme 2016-17. Under this programme about 50 toilets have been constructed for poor tribal families in these villages. As per plan all the family will have bio-toilet at the end of 2017.
- The socio-demographic report of all the adopted Gram Panchayats has been prepared after group meeting with villagers through PRA survey.
- The major problems of the villages related to drinking water, health, education, irrigation, mobile connectivity and agriculture has been raised to district authorities for their appropriate solutions.
- The development of linkages between district authorities, community and University are in progress through meetings with district level officers and villagers.
- The carrier guidance classes for 9 and 10th students has been conducted at Pudu and Umariadadar high schools. While remedial classes for 6th to 8th standard students on English and mathematics subject has been conducted at Ringwar, Tendubhata and Pudu villages.
- The drinking water samples from all the water sources of adopted villages have been collected by UBA team for testing. To solve the problem, PHE has sanctioned one hand pump for Ringwar village and three ponds are digging under MANREGA scheme.
- The assessment of nutritional and health status of school going children in all the GPs has been done.
- The farmers were motivated and awared by UBA on the benefits soil health card and demonstrated the method of composite soil sample collection to farmers of Lalmatipara (Ringwar) and Tendubhata.
