In the initial phase, GGV Shraavan Line will function for the Senior Citizens of selected areas and after completion of the Pilot Phase, GSL services will be extended to other groups also like youths, children, women, the specially-abled and others. 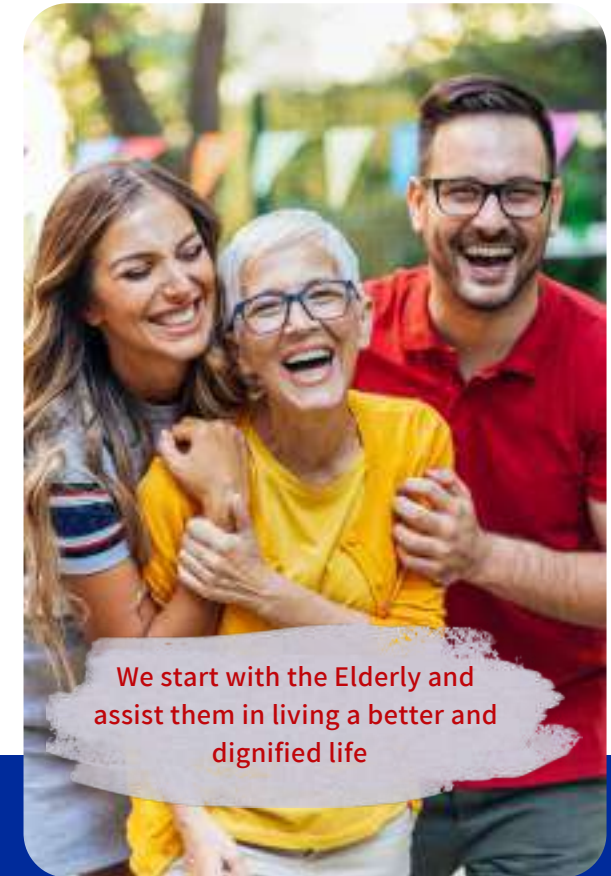
WHO WILL PROVIDE THE SERVICE

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ABOUT THE SCHEME

The GGV SHRAVAN Line is intended to provide 8 am to 8 pm seven days a week, 365 days a year, immediate and emergency response to (people in crisis) group of needy people priority wise at the initial phase, senior citizens and other groups like youths, children, women, specially-abled through referral (linking with appropriate authority such as police, hospital, old age homes, legal associations) and information about people in crisis related government schemes programs across the district/ state through a single uniform number. Under the Helpline Scheme, the University will launch a hotline number connected through a dedicated app initially in the district of Bilaspur and later on as per condition in the entire state the service may be coordinated by the Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya.

REGISTRATION PROCESS OF THE BENEFICIARIES

For any person interested in availing of the services of the Helpline, registration is an essential process. The beneficiaries have to register themselves through the app-based registration form with all relevant and essential information along with the undertaking mandatory to be submitted for successful registration. After successful registration, the record will be saved for future reference. The beneficiary may now choose the service as per his/her need. Through the mobile number, the registered person can call to avail of his/her preferred service, the specific service group will be directed through the helpline manager, and the call responders of the specific service group will forward the requirement for service delivery to the service provider.

ACCESSING HELPLINE

The Helpline will be accessible 12 hours a day 7 days a week to People in Crisis, preferably Senior Citizens and other groups (Youths, Children, Women and the Specially abled etc) through Telephone - landlines, mobile phones through calls, SMS/text messaging, mobile apps.



Target Group

The beneficiary group of this helpline will be preferably in the initial stage, the senior citizens 60 years and above, and the other groups (youth, women, children, and differently-abled persons) in the Bilaspur district.

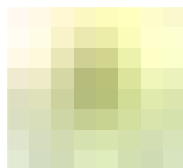

UNNAT BHARAT ABHIYAN (UBA)



Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India Programme to uplift rural India. This program is inspired by the vision of trans-formational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to help and build the architecture of an inclusive India.

Actually 68.9% of our population still lives in rural areas engaged in agriculture and allied sectors employing 51% of the total work force of India but accounting for only 17% of the Gross Domestic Product. It is well established that without rural development, India cannot optimally realize its growth potential and claim its place in the World.

Despite there being several past initiatives by governments at all levels – Central, State and local, the level of improvement has not kept pace with the rising aspirations of Indians. On most development parameters, there is still a significant gap between rural and urban India. In today's Knowledge Economy, it is not enough to mobilize financial resources. Professional and technical know-how, evolved through innovative experimentation and adapted to the social context is equally important. The implication is that rural development needs to be informed by a formal professional knowledge framework encompassing engineering, planning, management and application of social sciences as a holistic design approach. At the same time, such professional inputs need to be sensitive to the local context and community.

UBA IN GURU GHASIDAS VISHWAVIDYALAYA (GGV)



At the conference of the Vice Chancellors of Central Universities held on 4-5th February, 2015 at Rashtrapati Bhawan, New Delhi, it was resolved that every higher education institutes will adopt 5 villages for development as model villages. In order to comply by the gist of observation made by Hon'ble President in this conference as well as directions and guidelines received from the Ministry of Human Resource Development and University Grants Commission (Vide DO. No. F.13-13-2015(CU) dated 4 September, 2015), Vice Chancellor, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, Prof. Anjila Gupta took initiative first and appointed Dr. K.K Chandra, as Nodal Officer, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Cell for identification and adoption of Gram Panchayats under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan for this Vishwavidyalaya.

Viswavidyalaya has adopted four Gram Panchayats namely Umariyadadar, Pudu, Rigwar and Tendubhatha under this programme. UBA team aware local communities on health, educations, hygiene etc. besides facilitating developmental works in these villages with the help of district authorities.

- Holistic Development of cluster of adopted Gram Panchayats as model Gram Panchayats.
- Development of strong linkages between state government, village community and the University.
- Work to improve the economic status and living standards of the villagers.
- Spreading awareness and motivating villagers about health, hygiene and sanitation.
- Mobilization of various governmental programs and schemes in adopted GPs.
- Facilitating quality education in rural areas through career counseling & guidance for higher education and competitive examinations.
- Motivating for skill development and training to the rural youths and farmers.

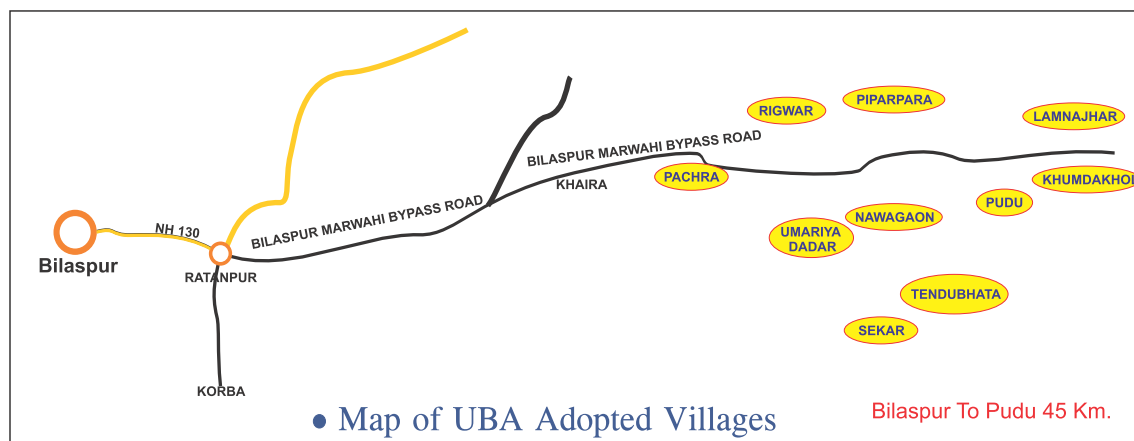

ADOPTED GRAM PANCHAYATS (GPS)

Viswavidyalaya has adopted four Gram Panchayats Umariyadadar, Pudu, Rigwar and Tendubhatha under this programme. The adopted Gram Panchayats are located in Bilaspur district and lies in remotest forest areas on $22^{\circ} 26.616' \text{ N}$ and $082^{\circ} 07.890' \text{ E}$, forms a cluster of 10 villages under Kota Development Block in Bilaspur – Ratanpur - Pendra road which is nearly 45 km from the Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh.

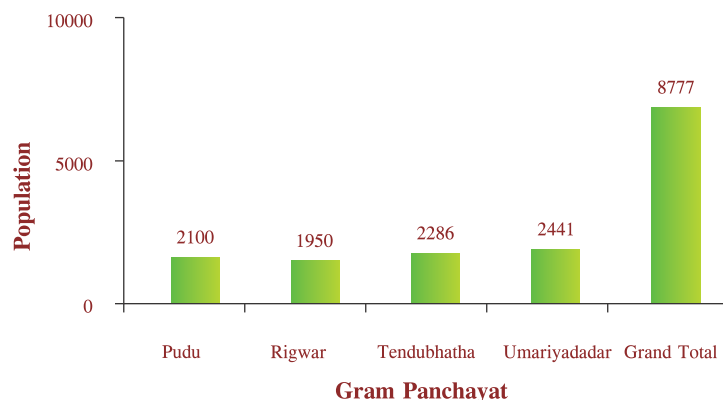


Population

Total population of the adopted GPs is about 8777 of which Pudu is biggest and Rigwar is the smallest in terms of populations. All the four GPs comprises of nine villages.

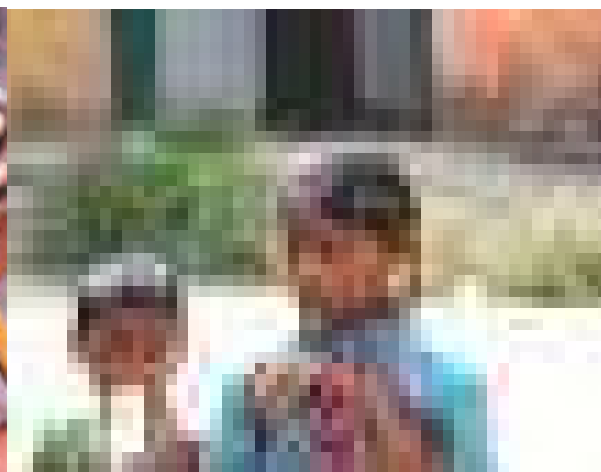
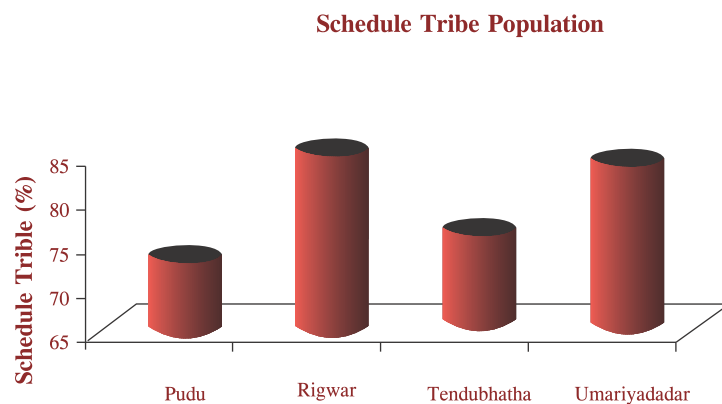
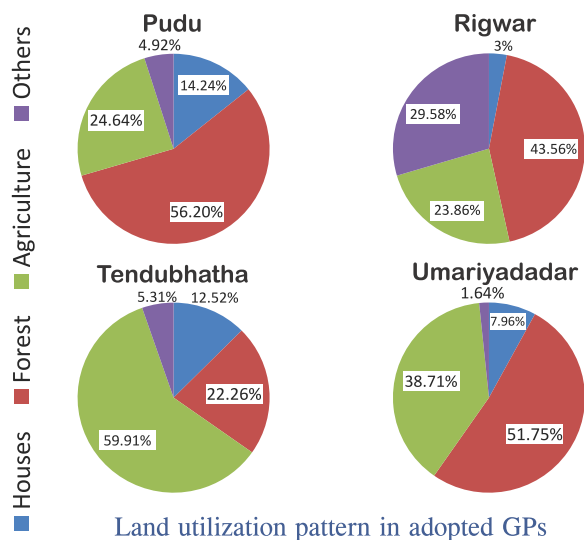


Social Structure

In Pudu 52.7% population are Kanwar and 13.35% Urao tribes while 50% Kanwar family resides in Rigwar. Tendubhatha also has Kanwar (48%), Bhainas (13%), Gonds (13%) and 26% of Yadav community. Similarly, Gond and Kanwar castes are dominant in Umariyadadar also.



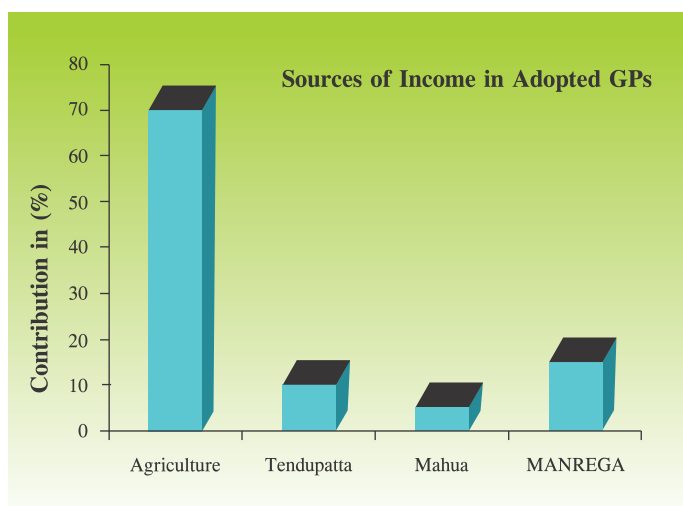
Birhor Tribal Women of Umariyadadar Village

Sources of Income

The main sources of income for villagers of the UBA adopted GPs are agriculture followed by labour works. Collection of Tendupatta and Mahua also contributes to considerable extent to the total income of the villagers. In Tendubhatha, Sekar and Umariyadadar farmers have adopted lac culture and all families have cows and buffalos.

Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) survey was conducted in all adopted GPs and a detailed **Socio-Economic Report** was prepared and has been sent to MHRD, UGC, New Delhi, Government of Chhattisgarh, and district authorities for necessary action. Since its adoption, UBA team regularly meets with District authorities for solving the identified problems and mobilization of various Government Schemes in the adopted villages. UBA team visits adopted villages every Friday for rapport building, create awareness on government schemes, education and interacts with villagers on various issues.

Major Problems of these adopted Villages

- Telephone, mobile network and internet facilities are completely unavailable.
- Drinking water is not available to villagers and in summer the problem become more intense.
- Need of at least one Higher Secondary School in the area besides of filling of the vacant posts of teachers in existing schools.
- The productivity of agriculture crops is very low and unsatisfactory.
- Sources of income are very limited for villagers.
- Most of the people are illiterate and unaware about Government schemes and their rights.

INITIATIVES BY UBA, GGV

1 SWACHCHHA BHARAT MISSION

To accelerate the efforts to achieve universal sanitation coverage and to put focus on sanitation even in rural areas, the Hon'ble Prime Minister has launched the Swachchha Bharat Mission Gramin on 2nd October, 2014. Unfortunately, India leads the world in open defecation and about 636 million Indians lack toilets. Open defecation mainly contributes to disease, childhood malnutrition and, as highlighted recently, violence against women. Initially, for us, promoting toilet in tribal villages was a struggle but now the villagers are sensitized to the need of toilets. This has resulted from regular meetings, interactions with villagers and convincing them for making toilets and its benefits.

Before November, 2015 when Vishwavidyalaya identified these GPs for work, only 06 families had toilet but due to continuous efforts, jointly by UBA and Panchayat Sachiv, more than 700 families have their own toilets now. The construction of toilets in remaining houses is also going on in full swing and it is hoped that the whole cluster of adopted GPs will be ODF very soon. Team members also contacted CEO Kota and CEO, Jila Panchayat, Bilaspur for mobilization of funds for toilet construction in these adopted GPs. Jila Panchayat is funding and implementing agency of this programme.

In order to change the mind set of tribal people, UBA team regularly meets and motivates villagers with the help of Panchayat Sachiv, Sarpanch and other elected village representatives for the construction and the use of toilets.

2 FINANCIAL LITERACY CAMP

Literacy on financial matters such as bank accounts, saving schemes, loaning etc. plays a pivotal role in the economic development of any community. Our UBA team is focused on creating awareness on different schemes of banks viz Kisan Credit Card, Mudra Loan, Crop Insurance Schemes and linkage with AADHAR Card. To motivate rural people for financial literacy, one mega camp was organized on 27 June 2016 at Primary School campus, Pachra village of Umariyadadar Gram Panchayat.

Vice Chancellor, Guru Ghasidas Central University, Prof. Anjila Gupta, Chief General Manager State Bank of India Gramin, Lead Bank Manager, Bilaspur, Branch Manager SBI, Ratanpur and Punjab National Bank, Chapora motivated villagers on financial literacy. In this programme 09 youths of adopted villages were provided Pradhan Mantri Mudra loan for rural shops, hotels, cycle stores etc. Total 350 rural women and men were participated in the financial literacy camp.

CAREER COUNSELING AND COMPUTER CLASSES

High school education up to 10th class is available at Pudu and Umariyadadar, while education up to middle school level is available in Tendubhatha and Rigwar villages. After high school, an average of 50% students move out for higher education as the education centers are situated at long distances from all adopted villages, and as the students have to travel 12 kms to Khaira village for a Higher Secondary School. Moreover, in existing schools there is acute shortage of teachers, which affects teaching adversely.



UBA team Conducts Career Counseling Classes for High School Students

UBA team has undertaken the task to encourage rural students through motivational and remedial classes. Two motivational and career orientation classes were organized for 120 students of 9th and 10th standard at Pudu and Umariyadadar high schools. UBA team informs the students about various competitive examinations from time to time. The team has also taken up the task to conduct computer classes for high school students and remedial classes for students of all level at our adopted GPs. Students have been benefitted with these classes and rural students have been encouraged for higher education and to make their base strong on the basic subjects.

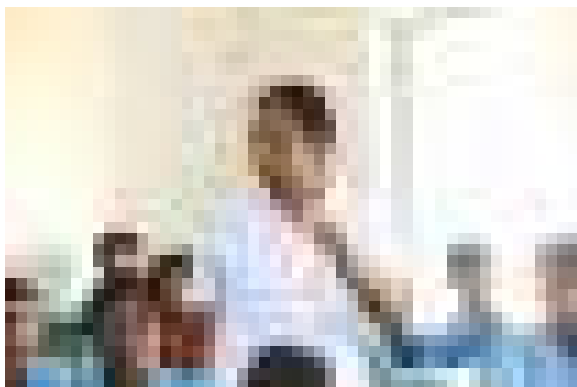

UBA team regularly raises the problems of these schools to District Education Officer and District Collector. Team is also in close contact with bank and the industries for CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) funds to equip these school with modern facilities. B.Ed. students of our Vishwavidyalaya also taught in schools of adopted villages under the teaching learning programme.

PLANTATION PROGRAMME

These villages have large coverage under natural forest, however, a massive plantation drive was initiated during 2016 and 1250 plants of Sagon, Amrud, Khamar, Shatwan, Jamun, Kadamb and Sitafal were distributed free of cost to villagers of Sekar, and Umariyadadar villages with the help of State Forest Department. In addition, 21300 clonal plants of *Eucalyptus* were also distributed by Forest department to 78 farmers identified under Agroforestry Development and Green Chhattisgarh Schemes. More than 300 plants of Kathal and Lemon were also brought from horticulture department and distributed to 150 villagers of Rigwar, Sekar and Umariyadadar villages. In July

2017, School Students of Pudu and Rigwar has been motivated for plantations. In This programme 400 Plants of Amrud, Munga were distributed to students.

5 HEALTH ASSESSMENT FOR SCHOOL STUDENTS

During visit to different schools, UBA team observed many students were affected by malnutrition and health oriented problems. This gave us the idea of assessing the student health and reports the level of problem in the area. Primary and middle school at Tendubhatha, Pudu, Umariyadadar and Rigwar were included for health checkup and a total of 730 students were considered for examination on various health parameters viz. height, weight, arm and abdomen fat etc. the data is compiled and evaluated.

DEMONSTRATIONS FOR IMPROVING AGRICULTURE

Agriculture yield is very low in all adopted GPs as they use only farm yard manures and local seed varieties. In addition, the marginal and small farmers in these villages still don't know about recent advances and technologies in agriculture. Four demonstrations on collection of soil sample were conducted at Lalmatipara, Rigwar, Pudu and Tendubhatha, where 135 farmers and farm women were motivated for soil testing and soil health card.

A front line demonstration on the use of *Trichoderma* and *Pseudomonas* biopesticides was also conducted in 03 rice fields at Pachra village. The results were encouraging and they are now motivating others villagers for their use in all crops. We are also planning to convince farmers of the area for organic farming. One training programme on organic farming was organized on dated 7 - 8 June 2017, in which 50 farmers were participated from adopted Villages.

DISTRIBUTION OF CYCLES UNDER SARASWATI SCHEME

Saraswati Cycle Scheme of Chhattisgarh Government is very beneficial and popular programme that helps girl students of high school for continuous education. With the initiatives of UBA team, 26 girls students of Government High School Umariyadadar have been provided cycles and now they come to school regularly even from remote and forest areas. This scheme also motivates girl students of middle classes for continuing higher education.

PROMOTION OF UJALA YOJNA

Pradhan Mantri Ujala Yojna has been promoted in the adopted villages with the result that almost 30% village families are using LED lights now. We had invited meeting of villagers, made public announcements to promote the scheme. In this scheme each BPL family was given 4 LED bulbs free of cost while others were given on subsidized rate.

PROMOTION OF PRADHAN MANTRI UJJWALA YOJNA

Under this Scheme, so far about 300 families have been benefitted in our Unnat Bharat Abhiyan adopted Gram Panchayats and received cooking gas cylinder with Chulhas. UBA team motivates villagers and provides necessary helps and guidance for successful implementation of this scheme in all adopted GPs. Other families are also being encouraged for Ujjwala Yojna so that the maximum number of rural families may be benefitted. This scheme will play a very important role in the conservation of forests as 99% families are using fuel wood for their energy requirements, which is collected from forest area.

ATTACHMENT OF UNIVERSITY STUDENTS TO ADOPTED VILLAGES

All 11 units of National Service Scheme (NSS) of the Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya have been allotted one village for organizing one day and seven day camp for social work. In one day NSS camp, 100 NSS volunteer visited Pachra village, cleaned the school premises, helped villagers in making toilets and also motivated villagers on different issues.

Thirteen students of B.Ed, IVth semester, Education department were attached to High School and Middle School Umariyadadar, Rigwar and Pudu for teaching works from 20th January to 28 February, 2017. M.Sc. and B.Sc., Anthropology students also attached for socio-demographics profile study of tribal communities of Umariyadadar and Tendubhata GPs.

Recently one week NSS camp was organized from 25 February to 3th March, 2017 at Tendubhatha School and the volunteers gave their services in Swachchha Bharat Mission toilet construction, cleaning of ponds, school, road site, motivation to rural people on health and hygiene, guiding the rural students for higher education etc. Similarly, two camps organized at Umariyadadar and Pudu on 21-27 March 2017 in which NSS volunteers provided their services in community developments.

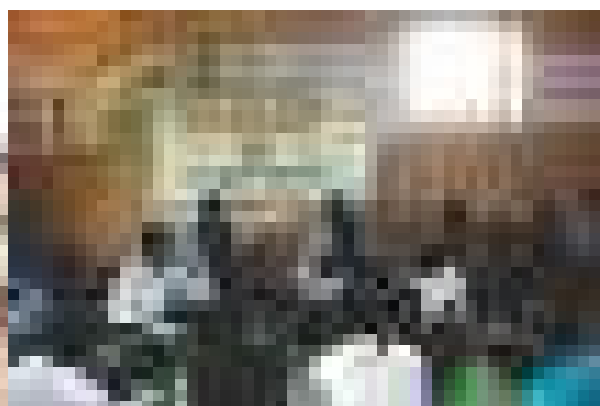

12 ANALYSIS OF DRINKING WATER



UBA Team Member's Collecting Water Samples for its Quality Analysis

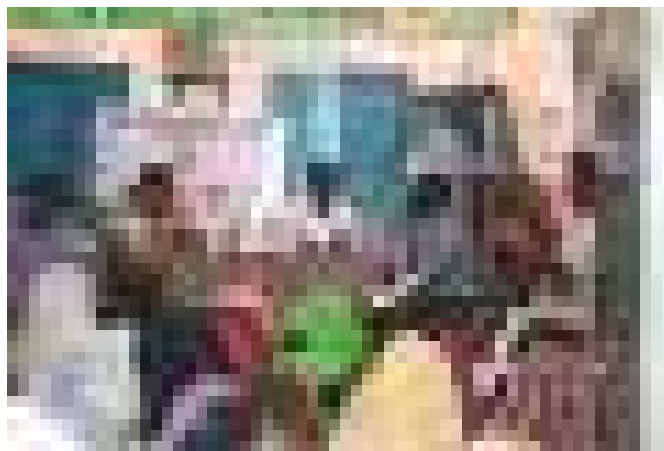
The main problem of all our adopted Gram Panchayats is the non-availability of safe drinking water. Most of the water from hand pumps are red in color and gets dried during summer. The people have to depend on one or two wells and hand pumps for potable water during summer. We collected water samples from hand pumps of adopted villages and analyzed to check the quality of drinking water. As the availability of water is a major problem in the area, UBA team has already submitted an application in Public Health Engineering Department (PHE) for an

over-head tank based water supply system for

Umariyadadar and Pudu villages. During last year, 2 hand pumps were sanctioned and installed in Rigwar and recently 01 hand pump was installed in Pudu School by PHE due to efforts of UBA team of the University. Irrigation facility is also lacking in the area. In this regard, we have conveyed this problem to District Collector, Bilaspur and also suggested means to supply water from Badbudanala dam of Sekar village.

13 AWARENESS ON SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Vishwavidyalaya has conducted awareness training for tribal women at Pudu, Rigwar and Umariyadadar GPs to encourage villagers for skill development programs. We are encouraging rural youth for skill development training in various categories viz. plumbing, computer repairing, nursing, tailoring etc. More than 25 women and youth have been motivated for different business oriented training. Now we are identifying rural youth and school drop outs for various employment oriented training. In this regards UBA is in close contact with Livelihood colleges for training to rural peoples and school drop outs. In the areas shop, motor mechanic, plumber, computer operator, tailoring etc. are having great demand.

HEALTH CAMP

Looking at the high MMR (Maternal Mortality Rate) and IMR (Infant Mortality Rate), 48 and 263 respectively, in the district, two health camps have been organized in the adopted GPs. One camp was especially organized at Umariyadadar for Baiga and Urao tribes with the help of health department. Intensive health check-up facilities were provided to about 150 people of tribal communities and walker sticks and mosquito nets were distributed to old aged and needy persons.

One district level health camp was again organized on 9th December, 2016 which was inaugurated by the Vice Chancellor of Guru Ghasidas Central University Prof. Anjila Gupta, in the presence of the District Collector as Chief Guest. More than 10 stalls were established which provided complete health check-up of blood, diabetic, eye disease, general OPD, skin disease, pregnant women, student check-up etc. More than 400 villagers including students benefitted from this camp. Over 100 walker sticks were distributed to the elderly villagers free of cost.

IMPACT ANALYSIS

UBA programme was implemented by Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya in the Month of October, 2015, during this short period of times, UBA team has initiated number of activities for the upliftment of the rural communities. The following are the achievements of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan started by the University:-

- ❖ The number of families having toilets has gone from 6 to more than 700. It could be possible only due to joint efforts made by UBA team, Sarpanch, Panchyat Sachiv and Janpad Panchayat Officials. Rigwar Panchayat has been declared ODF .
- ❖ A Financial Literacy Camp was organized by the UBA team at Pachra village for 350 participants, in which 09 rural youth and women were provided Pradhan Mantri Mudra loan.
- ❖ Two health camps were organized jointly with the Health Department at Pudu and Umariyadadar and 100 walkers were distributed. In Umariyadadar camp 150 mosquito nets and 30 walkers were distributed to the persons belonging to the baiga and birhor tribes.
- ❖ UBA team promoted Ujjwala yojna in the adopted Gram panchayats, under the scheme more than 300 LPG cylinders were provided to rural BPL families.
- ❖ Under Ujala yojna, more than 100 families received LED bulbs free of cost.
- ❖ A comprehensive Socio-economic report was prepared for UBA adopted villages.
- ❖ Two career orientation classes were organized at Pudu and Umariyadadar high schools in which 120 students were motivated for higher classes.
- ❖ Computer application classes were also conducted at Pudu and Umariyadadar high schools.
- ❖ A proposal for up gradation of High School, Pudu to Higher Secondary School has been forwarded by district authority and sent to Higher Education, CG Government for its approval.
- ❖ Total 03 hand pumps, two in Rigwar and 01 in Pudu have been successfully installed.
- ❖ About 2000 fruit plants were distributed free of cost in the adopted villages. Forest Department has provided 21,300 plants of Eucalyptus to 78 selected farmers.

- ❖ Health assessment for 750 students of Tendubhatha, Umariyadadar, Rigwar and Pudu village were done to identify nutritionally deficient students.
- ❖ UBA team visits these villages on every Friday, meets villagers and has developed a strong rapport with the villagers.
- ❖ Demonstration on the use of Trichoderma and Pseudomonas biopesticides were conducted in the field of Rice at Pachra village.
- ❖ Four demonstrations on collection of composite soil samples and soil health card were organized in Pudu, Rigwar and Tendubhatha GPs in which 135 farmers were participated.
- ❖ Three National Service Scheme (NSS) Camps each of one week were organized at Tendubhatha, Pudu and Umariadadar village.
- ❖ Thirteen students of Bachelors of Education (B.Ed.) IVth semester were attached for teaching and learning process in high school and middle school of Umariyadadar, Pudu and Rigwar for two months.
- ❖ B.Sc./B.A. and M.Sc./M.A. students of Anthropology Department were also attached twice for 10 days to Umariyadadar and Tendubhata for study.
- ❖ One Ph.D. scholar of Rural Technology Department and three scholars from Botany Department are doing their doctoral research covering the adopted villages.
- ❖ One research project awarded to Dr. V Mandel and Dr. K.K. Chandra from NRDMS (DST), New Delhi for developing natural pesticides for paddy.
- ❖ One skill development camp was organized in Gram panchayat Pudu in which 25 women participants were motivated for mushroom, poultry etc.
- ❖ One five day yoga camp was organized jointly by Aayush Department and UBA at Pudu from 27 to 31 January, 2017.
- ❖ Water samples were collected from all the hand pumps, wells and ponds and were analyzed to check the quality of drinking water.
- ❖ With the initiatives by the UBA team, 26 girls of high school, Umariyadadar were provided bicycles by District Education Department.
- ❖ Participants of Research Methodology for Social Sciences also visited Rigwar to see the initiatives taken by UBA.
- ❖ Two days Training on Organic Farming was organized at Rigwar Panchayat for 50 farmers on 7 -8 June 2017.

Annual Report 2017-18

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India Programme to uplift rural India. Unnat Bharat program is inspired by the vision of transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge institutions to help and build the architecture of an inclusive India. In compliance of MHRD letter on dated 24th August, 2015 and UGC vide DO No. F.13-13-2015(CU) dated 4/09/2015, Vice Chancellor, Prof. Anjila Gupta took initiative first and constituted Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Cell in this Vishwavidyalaya and Dr. K. K. Chandra, Associate Professor, Department of Forestry, Wildlife & Environmental Sciences was appointed a Nodal Officer alongwith 04 other committee members to work for Unnat Bharat Abhiyan. Under UBA04 Gram Panchayats (GPs) Pudu, Rigwar, Tendubhata and Umariadadar, comprising 09 villages of Kota Block, Bilaspur, dominated with tribal population has adopted.

Since adoption of GPs, the UBA team visits every Friday to these GPs, interacts with villagers and discusses their problems. At the same time UBA team meets with authorities for the implementation of different schemes in our adopted GPs and solutions of village problems. Thus UBA team has played a role in establishing linkages between villages and District Authority.

The following activities were taken during 2017-18 under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan program:-

- A two days training on “Organic Farming” was organized on 7th and 8th June at Gram Panchayat Rigwar. Total 45 farmers from all adopted gram panchayats participated and benefitted. The application of Trichoderma and Pseudomonas biopesticides were demonstrated in rice crop.
- Student of B.Sc. Rural Technology visited Ringwar Piparpara village for the study the of rural livelihood and problem identification of the UBA adopted villages.

- UBA team motivated people regularly for construction and use of toilets under Pradhan Mantri Swachha Bharat Mission. Two gram panchayats Rigwar and tendubhatha has been declared ODF while 90% works in other villages has been completed.
- One day training on Sanitary Education organized for girl students on 15/09/2017 at government high school Pudu and Umariadadar, in which 132 girl participants interacted with the expert on sanitary tips during monthly cycle.
- A ten days training on “Computer Education” was organized during 20th Sept to 6/10/2017 at high school Pudu and Umariadadar to educate rural students for use and applications of computer.
- UBA bulletin published depicting UBA activities undertaken by GGV since adoption of villages, which has been sent to MHRD, UGC, IIT Delhi and to other officials of district authorities. The bulletin is also uploaded in UBA website by IIT Delhi so that other participating institute may also see out activities conducted under UBA.
- One day camp of NSS organized on 11 November, 2017 in which 50 student volunteers visited Umariadadar village under UBA and encouraged villagers on health, hygiene etc.
- UBA team attended two day’s workshop on community curriculum development and signed MoU between GGV and NCRI, Hyderabad.
- Ujjwala Yojna has been promoted in these villages results that more than 410 families got LPG gas free of cost.
- MoU between UBA IIT Delhi, National Co-ordinator, Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Program MHRD, GOI and GGV has been done. IIT, Delhi has released Rs. 1.75 lakh under UBA for house hold and village survey and for preparation of village development plan.
- Four camps of NSS of one week durations have been organized during the year comprising 264 students involving various departments of the University in UBA adopted villages. First camp organized during 23 Feb – 01 March for 75 students of Institute of Technology and UTD at Tendubhatha village, second and third NSS camp during 10 – 16 March, 2018 at Pachra and Umariadadar villages respectively for students of School of Natural resource, School of Physical Sciences, School of Engineering and technology and School of Management and Commerce, (65 students), and School of Life sciences and School of Art and women unit of UTD (72 students). Last camp of this series organized on 22 – 28 March, 2018 at Pudu village for 52 students of department of law and department of Pharmacy. During the camps NSS volunteers worked on cleaning of ponds, making of pits near hand pump, making toilets alongwith taking part in awareness programmes on health and hygiene to rural communities.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya is actively participating in Unnat Bharat Abhiyan under coordination institute, IIT, Delhi after signing MoU with IIT Delhi. It is a Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India Programme implemented to involve higher education institutes for technological transfer for the transformational change in rural development processes by leveraging knowledge higher institutions. Since September, 2015 community development cell and Unnat Bharat Abhiyan cell was constituted and 05 members team was appointed including one Nodal Officer Dr. K. K. Chandra, Associate Professor, Department of Forestry, Wildlife & Environmental Sciences. Under UBA04 Gram Panchayats (GPs) Pudu, Ringwar, Tendubhata and Umriyadader, comprising 09 villages of Kota Block, Bilaspur, dominated with tribal population has adopted.

UBA team visits every Friday to the villages of adopted GPs to meet villagers and discusses their problems. The identified problems of the villagers are then conveyed to district authorities for appropriate solutions and also for the implementation of different schemes in these adopted GPs. Thus UBA team is playing its role developing linkages between villages and District Authority.

The following activities were taken during 2018-19 under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan program:-

- Gram sabha meetings were organized in all 04 gram panchayats where Sarpanch, Gram Sachiv and other member and villagers of the villages were invited for preparing of effective village development plan (VDP) of adopted villages.
- Fruit plants of 1000 nos namely Moringa, lemon, Guava, Kathal and papaya were distributed to students of Pudu, Rigwar, Umariyadadar and Pachra school with aims to facilitate balance nutrition especially to girl students of rural area and also to motivate for tree planting and nature care. Improved variety of bamboo was also provided free of cost to farmers of Tendubhatha for planning.
- Swachhta hi seva program was initiated in Umariyadadar and Rigwar village in September- October months where swachhta rally was organized by 150 NSS volunteers of the Vishwavidyalaya. CEO Janpad Panchayat Kota, Kunal Dudawat (IAS) was chief guest in this programme. Villagers were encouraged against alcohol drinking, girls education, and health issues through nukkad natak and play programmes.
- Two programme on legal and fundamental rights awareness was organized for 96 rural students and villagers in Umariyadadar and Pudu, where a group of LLB students from GGV explained about fundamental rights and legal safety of citizen.
- Promotion of Swachha bharat scheme was done in all adopted villages results 03 adopted GPs has been declared ODF while last one has also completed 90% target of toilet construction. UBA team regularly visits to beneficiaries of this scheme and promotes for its use.
- PM Ujjwala Yojna has been promoted in all adopted villages results more than 400 poor families has their own LPG cylinders.
- Two mushroom Training cum demonstration programme was organized for 55 women and rural youth of Rigwar and Tendubhata village under skill development programme. Free span of mushroom was distributed to beneficiaries for mushroom production.
- One day workshop on home herbal and kitchen garden was organized in Umariyadadar adopted village for 38 participants. Traditional healers of vaidya sangh and UBA team member displayed different herbs for identification and use in controlling of diseases at local level as well as the conservation of forest.
- Village development plan (VDP) of all 04 gram panchayats (GPs) has been prepared and uploaded to unnat bharat abhiyan portal of GOI successfully. The adopted villages has

been surveyed and data collected in different parameters has also already uploaded in UBA portal.

- Seven proposal of technology transfer based on priority areas of Chhattisgarh Government Narwa, Ghurwa, Ghurwa and Bari (NGGB) has been prepared by UBA team member of the University which is being submitted to Jila Panchayat for its funding and implementation in adopted villages.
- To develop competitiveness among rural students 04 painting competition and easy writing competition were conducted in school of all adopted GPs and prize were distributed to participants.
- Badminton items, football and other sports items were donated Sekar, Pachra, Rigwar and Tendubhatha schools to promote sports activities since primary education.
- Forty students of B.Sc./ BA anthropology were attached for 10 days to Umariyadadar village for survey of tribal families and study of their culture and customs.
- Four farmers were given seeds of Jimikand (Improved variety) for commercial cultivation. To improve the agriculture income of the farmers, biofungicides and trichoderma were distributed for seedling treatment in Rigwar and Pachra village.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

[April 2019 to 31 March 2020]

Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya has adopted 04 gram panchayats namely Umariadadar, Pudu, Ringwar and Tendubhatha and its dependent villages of Kota development blocks of Bilaspur district as per directions of the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), New Delhi. These villages are dominated with tribal communities and are 45 km away from district headquarter Bilaspur. Since adopted of the villages under UBA, vishwavidyalaya are regularly organizing different programmes for the benefits of the villagers. Some of the activities are as follows:

Rapport Building: UBA team visits every Friday to adopted GPs and discusses village problems which is conveyed to district administration. Gram Panchayats meeting were also conducted to prepare village development plans for the adopted villages.

Awareness programme on Swachhata: To promote swachhata in villages, students were motivated through organizing painting competitions during 15 September to 15 October, 2019. Three painting competitions for middle school students of Umariyadadar, Tendubhata and Ringwar on “Swachhata” during September - October, 2019. Fifty two students were participated in these competitions.

Village development programmes: Household survey of the adopted villages has been conducted and village development plans has been prepared. On the basis of plan 07 project proposal has been submitted to expert group of Unnat Bharat Abhiyan, IIT, New Delhi for funding on different aspects of village development such as improved agriculture, mushroom production, lac production, medicinal plants, health and hygiene.

Career counseling Classes: Rural students have been motivated for higher studies and competitive examinations by organizing career orientation classes at high school pudu and umariadadar. Nukkad natak has been also organized by NSS volunteer in these villages to promote *beti bachao beti padhao*, ill effects of alcohol drinking etc.

Plantation drive: One day workshop on medicinal plant was organized at Umariyadadar panchayat on May, 2019 to aware villagers on medicinal plant conservation, propagation and its

use. Villagers were encouraged for planting of fruit species in their homestead gardens and also provided saplings to villagers.

Skill development Trainings

Two training on mushroom production were organized in Tendubhatha and Rigwar panchayats during January, 2019 for 35 villagers.

Training and Demonstration for Improved agriculture

Biofertilizers were provided to 04 farmers of Pachra and Tendubhatha village for demonstration in Paddy fields and organic production. Improved seed of Elephant foot yam (Jimikand) was also distributed free of cost to 05 farmers for higher income and seed production.

MoU with IIT Delhi: Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalya has signed MoU between Unnat Bharat Abhiyan with Coordinating Institute, IIT Delhi work for rural development with the leverage knowledge of University and other higher institutes.

Since adopted of the villages under UBA, vishwavidyalaya are regularly organizing different programmes for the benefits of the villagers. Vishwavidyalaya has signed MoU with IIT Delhi to facilitate rural development programs in these villages. During the year the following activities were organized in these villages.

Rapport Building: UBA team visits regularly to adopted villages, discusses their problems and conveyed to district administration for their solutions.

COVID 19 awareness programs

Awareness programs on Covid 19 conducted in all the adopted villages during pandemic period to control the spread of pandemic disease in adopted villages. Through intensive visits about 600 villagers and migrant workers were provided mask and sanitizers by UBA Nodal Officer Dr. K. K. Chandra and UBA team. The method of immunity boosting were demonstrated among rural resident through medicinal kadha preparation, tulsi extract and yoga practices.

Free distribution of medicinal plants for home garden

To enrich the kitchen and homestead gardens of adopted villages medicinal plants were provided free of cost. More than 2000 saplings of Giloe, Bramhi, Tulsi, Butch, Piper, stevia were distributed in adopted villages for its domestication and to promote ayurvedic formulations for enhancing immunity.

Skill development Trainings

Training on mushroom production was organized in Pudu panchayat and women self-help group were motivated for mushroom cultivation and marketing.

Program for diversified agriculture

Looking the potential of Elephant foot yam (Jimikand) in adopted villages and to increase the income tribal dominated farming communities, a training program was conducted at Tendubhatha Panchayat. In this program 40 farmers and farm women of all adopted villages were invited for a

demonstrative training and also provided improved seeds of jimikand for its commercial cultivation.

Rapport Building: UBA team and interact to villagers and identified the issues of the villages which were conveyed to district administration for appropriate solutions. UBA team members Dr. K K Chandra (Nodal Officer) and other members Dr. S. K. Sahi, Dr. D. K. Patel, Dr. Subal Das and Dr. Ramesh Gohe regularly visited adopted villages and has developed a strong rapport with the villagers.

COVID 19 awareness programs

Corona awareness campaign conducted in all the adopted villages during pandemic period to protect the rural community of the adopted villages. Through door to door visits, a team of UBA reached to the 1000 villagers across adopted gram panchayats and distributed medicinal plants of Giloe, Stevia, Tulsi, Butch, Aloe, etc. in adopted villagers. Also demonstrated the use of ayurvedic kadda preparation and planting of medicinal plants in homestead gardens.

Financial literacy camp

A district level financial literacy camp was organized on 29 September 2021 at Pudu village to aware and benefit peoples of adopted villages on different government schemes, saving methods and Kisan Credit Cards, etc. CEO Janpad panchayat Mrs Lalita Bhagat attended the programme as a Chief Guest followed by Chief Manager, State Bank of India, Bilaspur Shri Devdas Chatterjee. In this camp speakers and bankers encouraged rural community and women self-help groups for

starting mushroom production, composting unit, agarbatti production, and other rural production and income generation activities. In the camp 150 villagers and women groups were participated.

Mushroom production training for income generations

Village self-help groups of the adopted villages particularly Pudu Panchayats were trained for mushroom production technology and value addition. After training they were motivated further through regular interaction and discussion. Total fifty women's participated in Mushroom training program organized in Pudu Gram Panchayats.

NSS Camp in adopted villages

Two camps of one week duration were conducted at Rigwar and Pudu Gram Panchyats where 160 NSS volunteers of the university attended the camps and participated in different NSS activities in these villages.

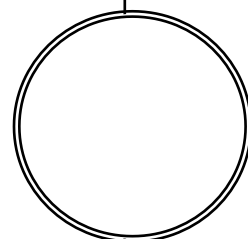

Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Scheme is an important scheme of the Government of India. Under the scheme, a pairing of Guru Ghasidas University and Central University of Gujarat has been made. Since March 2020, there has been a situation of lockdown all over the world due to Covid-19 pandemic. Due to general covid-19 protocols and many other administrative restrictions, the activities of the scheme are being not carried out. In the session 2020-21, the following on-line or digitalized programs were organized in Guru Ghasidas University under the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Scheme-

1. An on-line meeting of EBSB Club was organized on 26th July. In the meeting, the outline of various activities was prepared.
2. An on-line session of Gujarati language was attended by 25 students of various Departments from 20th April 2020 to 27th April 2020.
3. An on-line session of Chhattisgarhi language learning program had been organized by Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya on 21st August 2020 to 28th August 2020. This program was specially organized for the students of Central University of Gujarat.
4. On 10/02/2021, an on-line competition for making Gujarati food was organized. In this competition, the students had to make a 3-minute video of any one Gujarati dish made by themselves. 18 students created and submitted their videos in the competition.
5. The created video link was shared with students based on video multiple choice questions created and uploaded as Google form and the Google form link was shared with all students. Exam was conducted from 15th to 18th August 2021.

More than 250 students participated in quiz competition. Total of 47 students out of 57 scored more than 50 marks, 73 students scored more than 40 marks. These selected students will be taken to Chhattisgarh for next event after lockdown situation by further scrutiny through one more quiz competition.

6. A quiz competition had been organized on culture, heritage, history and art of Chhattisgarh on 7/09/2021 through Google forms. Multiple choice questions created and uploaded as Google forms and the Google forms link was shared with all students of Gujarat and Chhattisgarh both.
7. In this competition, about 279 students participated from Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya, Bilaspur, Shree Dhanvantary Pharmacy College, Kim, Surat (Gujarat) and Gujarat Central University, Gujarat out of which 111 secured more than 50% marks and got certificates. The quiz competition was organized with the help of Mr. Agnivesh Pandey, Assistant Professor, Department of Information Technology, School of Studies in Engineering and Technology, Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya.
8. Dr. Vivekananda Mandal delivered a lecture through online mode on “Hands on Training on Indian Patent Filing and Document Handling” under the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat programme on 09.09.2021. More than 70 participants joined the programme through Google Meet. Students and faculty from GGV and from the pairing institute Dhanvantrai College of Pharmacy and Gujarat Central University, Gujarat joined the programme. 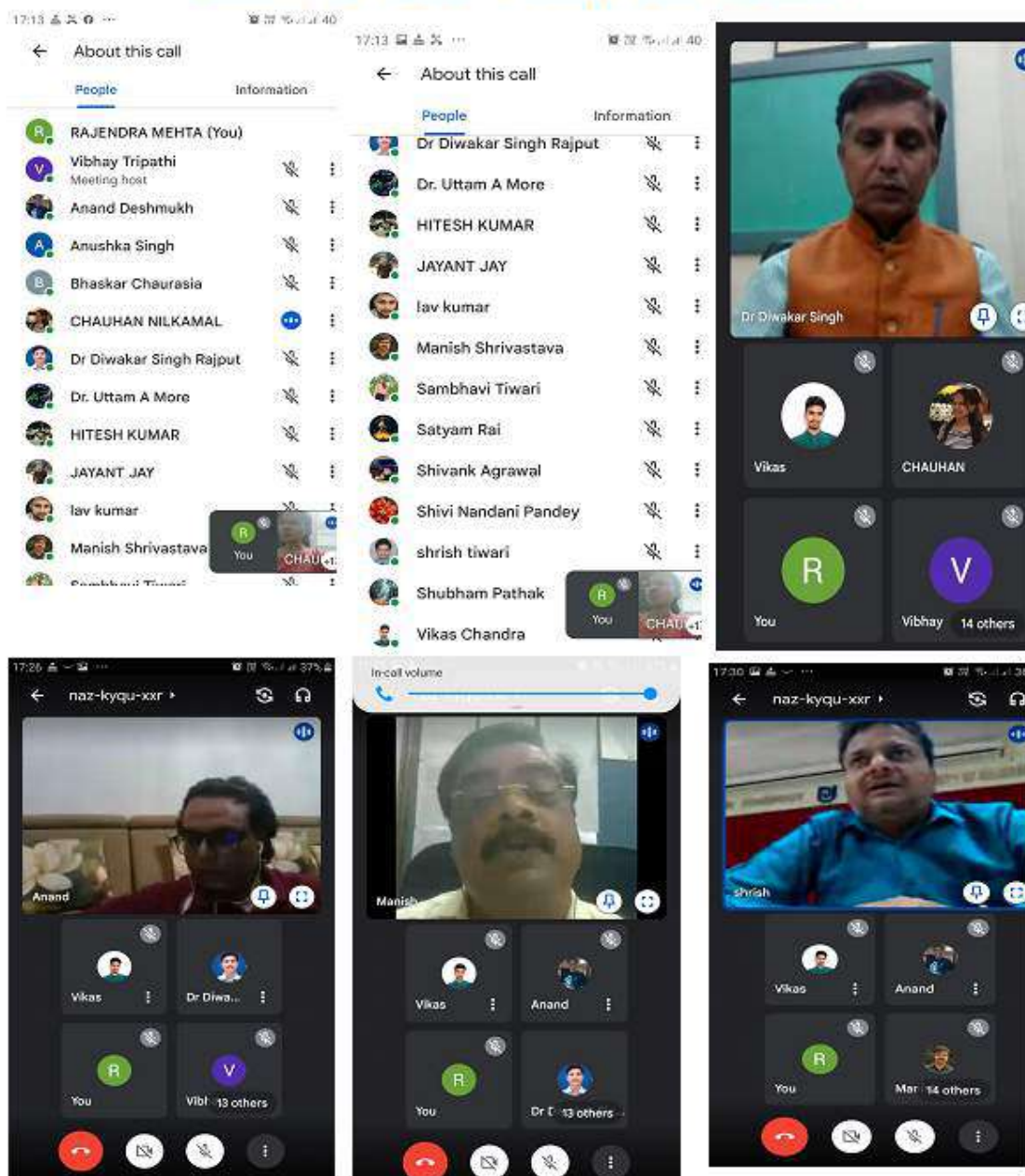

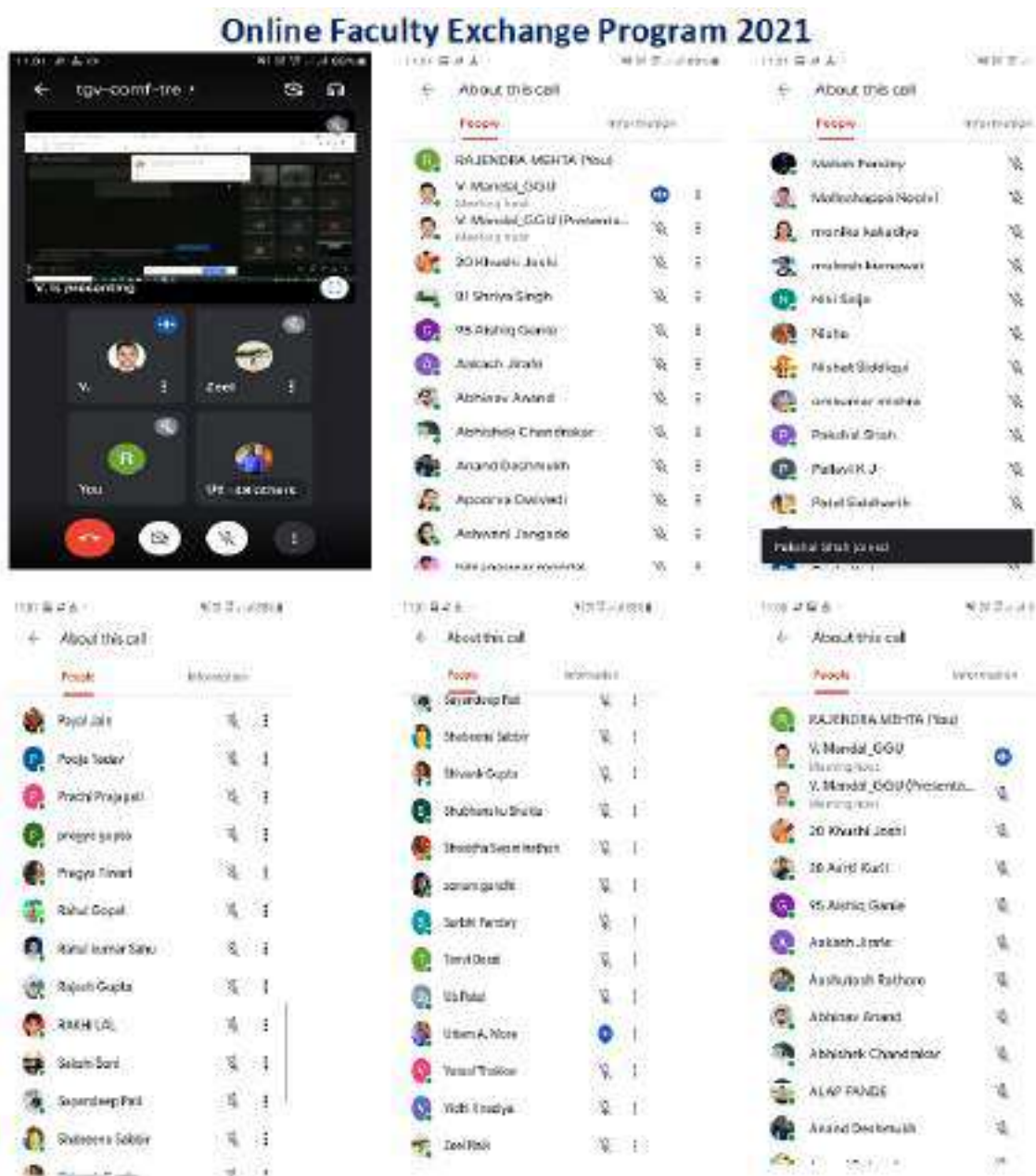

(Brief Information)

The National Service Scheme is governed and funded by Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India. It provides opportunity to the students of various levels to take part in government sponsored community service activities & programs. The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands on experience to young students in delivering community service. It was started in Guru Ghasidas Vishwavidyalaya in the year 2016. At present there are Nine units with strength of 550 students actively functioning throughout the year.

Volunteers are regularly involved in various activities such as campus cleaning, plantation, watering of plants and participation in NSS activities. Various activities are summarized below:

- During this COVID- 19 pandemic, the volunteers and their respective program officers have reached all the way to common public to aware how to take precautionary measures and to follow government issued guidelines/ protocols through various means and methods. The volunteers have executed their roles like front line workers, despite the fact that it was life threatening the volunteers did exactly like the motto of National Service Scheme 'NOT ME BUT YOU'.
- Awareness among women and children was spread by group of NSS volunteers under the Blue brigade campaign of UNISEF. Following activities were done:
 - To assist the local administration in safe delivery of pregnant women, hundred percent vaccinations of children under the age of 5 years,
 - to help children in education in the absence of school facilities,

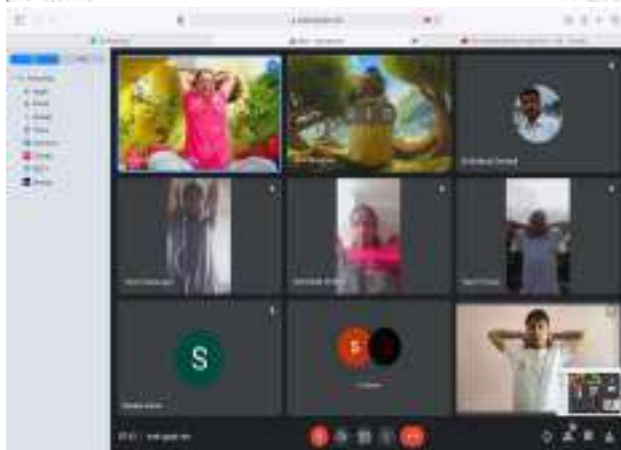

General Objective

To nurture the curiosity and creativity of the child, particularly in relation to the natural environment. Develop awareness about environmental issues. Make children able to solve environmental issues in an inclusive and fun learning manner.

Day 01: Plantation Activity using Seed

The objective of the activity was to teach the kids about the importance of seeds and how to grow them on their own with the least resources. The kids enjoyed and learned about the techniques of seed planting and observed their planted seed growing which gave them immense satisfaction and also were willing to perform the same on a regular basis in their schools/homes.



Day 02: Plantation Activity using Plants

Objective: The objective of the activity was to teach the kids about planting a plant using grafts of rose and how to grow them on their own with the least resources. The kids learned about the planting techniques using graft in the simplest way and were found very curious after the activity to see their efforts turning into a rose plant. This will help them to develop a mindset to grow such more plants and contribute to the wellness of environment.





Day 03: Seed Ball Making

Objective: The objective of the activity was to teach the kids about making seed balls just using seeds and soil and how to use them in their surroundings. The kids learned about the technique of making seed balls and enjoyed playing with soil which also made them learn about the importance of soil and how it can be used. Through teamwork, they made 308 seed balls in 15 minutes.



Day 04: Cleanliness Drive

Objective: The objective of the activity was to teach the kids about the importance of cleanliness in their surroundings and make them aware of properly disposing of waste. The cleanliness drive activity influenced the kids to keep the environment clean and not throw garbage everywhere. Through teamwork, they collected more than 5 kgs of waste in less than 15 minutes from the nearby area.



Day 05: Recycling Game Chart

Objective: The objective of the activity was to teach the kids about the segregation of collected waste materials in different bins based on the material of waste. Through this activity, the kids learned to differentiate between wastes and segregated them into plastic waste, paper waste, glass waste, metal waste for recycling and food waste for composting. They also learned that for what recyclable wastes can be used.



Day 06: Eco-bricks Making

Objective: The objective of the activity was to teach the kids about a unique technique of converting waste plastics into eco-bricks. The activity made the kids learn about the harmful impact of waste plastics on the environment and reduce them by converting them in the form of eco-bricks. They were also informed about the different uses of eco-bricks.



Day 07: Best Out of Waste

Objective: The objective of the activity was to teach the kids about recycling cardboard and converting them into birdhouses by using simple stationary utensils. Through this activity, the kids creatively learned to build the bird house in its simplest form using general stationary items. This activity helped them to explore their creative mind and learn new things. The activity was performed in different groups so that the kids will learn the importance of teamwork and respects other's decisions.



Day 08: Stone Painting

Objective: The objective of the activity was to teach the kids about the art of stone painting using stones and bright colours to enhance their creative mindset. This activity helped the kids to explore their creative minds and learn the art of stone painting which will help them in exploring new art forms and develop their minds in that direction.

Theme: Art and Craft Activities

General Objective

To make children learn about art and craft, learn basic skills of art and understand the concept of making craft items from simple things and easily available items. Divert kids towards physical and mental engagement in making things on their own and give a sense of happiness and joy

Day 1 & 2 Saturday & Monday (20 & 22 May 2023) The art and craft first-day class were on Straight lines and various geometrical shapes. Drawing straight lines can be difficult, especially for beginners. It is important to recognize that when drawing freehand, even the best artists will have some imperfections in their straight lines. Those subtle imperfections are acceptable and normal for freehand drawing. They often add more character and feeling to the drawing.

The major focus was on how to hold a pencil and practising straight lines involving 'to and fro' movement 3. Circle shape drawing, including sphere, ovule 4. Another geometrical shape like - Square, Rectangle, Triangle, 5. Based on a straight line - 3D shape practising- cube 6. 3D effect. Both the group of students below the 5-year age group and above 5 years of age will learn the basics of Drawing and the concept of colour.



Day-3 Tuesday (23/05/2023)

On 23rd May, 2023 (Tuesday) block printing was conducted with the help of vegetables (Potato, Onion and lady finger) and green leaf. Block printing is a good educational activity to teach patterns and explore the world around you. And it's a great activity for kids of all ages. The outcome of block printing for kids is to focus children's attention on line, shape, pattern and texture. It allows children to try out different techniques and to immediately see cause and effect in action.



Children of age group 5 and above were introduced to the Matka Painting and Decoration. Matka painting can not only be a hobby to keep your mind off stress but also an excellent way to add colour and creativity to your abode. Hence, through this activity kids' creativity, concentration and engagement were developed.



Day-4 Wednesday (24/05/2023)

On 24th May 2023 (Wednesday) dot painting of flowers was done by students under the age of 5 years. This activity was designed to develop the child's fine motor skills and strengthen grasp and manual control. This will enhance their motor ability and grip of their fingers. They learnt that a small change can make a big difference. they also learnt to look picture as a whole as said by Gestalt. this will help them in their problem-solving approaches also. The print of the flower was given and they used colour painting to fill the flower using the earbud. For children, 5 years and above again Matka decoration activity was continued and the children were fully engaged in this activity they beautifully decorated this Matka with the help of a mirror, jari, and lace.



Day-5 Thursday (25/05/2023)

On 25th May, 2023 (Thursday) button art was conducted for students under 5 years. The students were provided with the sheet in which they have to stick the button on the branches. Through this activity, they learned to stick the button on branches and hence they were able to recognize the branches of the tree.



The activity was designed to develop the technical skills among the students where they have to paste buttons only at the end of the branches. as well as this also developed the coordination between the finger and the place where they have to paste buttons.

For the age group 5 and above children were engaged in flower making with the help of origami paper, in which they prepared decorative flowers for their homes. Origami has been found to improve not only 3D perception and logical thinking but also focus and concentration. Hence, this activity was very fruitful for the children of all age groups.



Day-6 Friday (26/05/2023)

On 26th May 2023 (Friday) students under 5 age made crafts using earbuds, and therma col balls. They learned alignment and architectural skills. They pasted the Therma coal balls of



different colours.

Further, on the sixth day senior children prepared the snake with the help of origami paper and they enjoy a lot during this activity. Origami has been found to improve not only 3D perception and logical thinking but also focus and concentration.



Day-7 Saturday (27/05/2023)

On 27th May 2023 (Saturday) the thumb painting was conducted for students under 5 years of age. The thumb printing activity is a wonderful sensory experience for the children. It strengthens their hand and finger muscles. Children enjoyed this mess by playing with their thumbs and making an impression on given images. This activity supports sensory integration and improves fine motor development by strengthening finger and hand muscles. Kids also



learned about colours, shapes and spatial relationships. In this activity, the kids made a beautiful flower base with the help of their fingers. Children participated with full enthusiasm.

Further, on the seventh day senior children prepared the colourful fish with the help of origami paper and they enjoy a lot during this activity. Origami activity has been found to improve not only 3D perception and logical thinking but also focus and concentration.



Day-8 Monday (29/05/2023)

On 29th May 2023 (Monday) the clay modelling activity was conducted. This activity was conducted to improve hand-eye coordination skills. It is coordination between visual input and the performing task. it develops the aesthetic sense also and encourages trial and error. When a child learns to construct again and again, they enjoy the learning process and they learn to construct something new from their old experiences. This enhances their creativity and encourages the play- based learning. The children made different forms using the clay mould and using their hands. They also made 2-D shapes using the toothpick and clay which promoted their architectural skill and developing something new shapes using toothpicks.



On day eight, senior children prepared the teddy bear and shopping bag with the help of waste materials. Children made beautiful teddy bears with the help of sponges and rubber bands. This activity helps students to develop sensitivity towards nature and introduces the concept of reuse, reducing and recycle.



Day-9 Tuesday (30/05/2023)

On 30th May 2023 (Tuesday), The students made a collage on a picture of a mushroom. This activity was enjoyed by the students when they used the waste paper which was remaining from previous days. The collage will improve their fine motor skill and also develop a sense of reuse and recycle. This will inculcate a habit of no waste concept. students tear the paper which were already left over from other activity and used them to form new and fresh art form.



On the ninth day senior group prepared the pooja thali with the help of velvet paper, mirror, lace and other decorative items. This activity integrates and enhances the Indian culture and tradition among children and helps to understand the importance of festivals and other rituals.



Day-10 Wednesday (31/05/2023)

On the 10th day of the summer camp in the validity session, the exhibition of all the products prepared by children was done. In which invited guests and parents appreciated the children's creativity and hard work.

SUMMER CAMP

Theme: Grooming Socialization

General Objective

To make kids understand the basic concepts of socialization, family, friendship and the importance of relationships, grooming them to become more responsible as a person. Social grooming is an essential aspect of early childhood education and has a significant impact on a child's social and emotional development. The importance of social grooming in kindergarten objectives is evident in the way it helps children build relationships, develop empathy, and learn appropriate social behaviours.

Social grooming, also known as socialization, is the process by which children learn to interact with others in a socially acceptable manner. It involves teaching children how to communicate, cooperate, and resolve conflicts with their peers. Social grooming is an essential part of early childhood education because it helps children develop the social skills they need to succeed in school and life.

Mom & Dads Work

The objective of this activity was to just identify the work/role performed by the mother and father and make children realize the domestic work and understand the basic concept of gender roles. The purpose of this activity was to prepare kids and sensitize boys and girls for their role in domestic work and help their parents.



Role Play

Role play is the act of imitating the character and behaviour of someone who is different from yourself. The activity focuses on observation of different roles in the family and imitation of the roles preferred by the kids. In the entire activity, it was observed that kids were more observant towards their mother's role. They admitted that most of the work at home is performed by their mothers. Kids were asked about their interests to perform the role, and they picked the mother role, few boys were passive but they grasped the purpose of the overall activity.



Good Touch Bad Touch

It's essential to empower the children with the proper knowledge about good touch and bad touch. It is imperative to create opportunities to talk to the children and discuss what a good touch is and what is not. We may think that the child is too young to understand the difference between good and bad touch and other such topics, but they are not, we can talk about these subjects with ease so that they learn about them from an early age without getting scared. Kids were explained about various kinds of touches. For example, good touch feels caring, like a pat on the head, back, or a bear hug. In comparison, a bad touch can hurt your body or feelings, such as pinching, hitting, or touching any private area.

Children talked about the **SWIMSUIT Rule** that the parts covered by a swimming outfit or undergarments are private parts and anyone except them should not touch or see them, **Ownership of the body** was explained they have the choice to deny a handshake, a hug or any physical touch if they don't like it.

The purpose of this activity was to educate children about the difference between good and bad touch and let children know that it's ok to say no if you don't like any touch, even from a friend or a family member.



Pick a Toy

Pick a toy was the activity just to let the kids choose the kind of their preferred toys, it was observed that boys preferred toys with male characters and so was with girls who picked toys similar to their qualities, showing the maternal characters.



Sharing and Caring

Pre-schoolers are in the stage of life where it's not easy to make them learn to share their belongings. Sharing is a crucial Social Skill forcing kids to do so is not wise as this is not going to them to engage fully in the sharing process. So, it has to be designed and inculcated in them through activities where they participate and unknowingly learn how sharing helps accomplish certain things.

Kids were engaged in different activities and games to understand that to share is to spread joy because we believe that this critical skill becomes easy to get learned when kids play and learn, which sows the seed of empathy and helps in building the social skills required for well-adjusted adults. The purpose of this activity was to make kids feel and understand that if someone shares something with any other person that means they CARE for the person.

Kids played colour a beach ball and share the pencil activity.



Let's introduce my new friend (Senior citizens)

Through this activity, the children were asked to explain the concept of a friend in their words. Children were asked to make a new friend who may be a grandmother or a grandfather of their residential area or their own family. Through this activity, it is expected to develop a bonding between two generations the very young and the senior citizens promoting **Intergenerational Relationships**. Intergenerational relationships refer to the chain of relationships between ageing parents, adult children, grandchildren and even great-grandchildren. There's a certain reciprocity between each family member that benefits each of the generations. Growing intergenerational friendships with others can offer a unique perspective on life, as the older generations help the younger ones learn what to expect in their futures and offer advice to

ensure they're living their best lives. In turn, a younger person can help someone older be a little more adventurous, getting them out of their daily routines. Both parties can benefit from these different perspectives and approaches to life.



Gratitude Journal

A gratitude journal is a simple yet powerful tool that can help cultivate a more positive mindset, reduce stress, and increase happiness. We often focus on what we want, rather than being grateful for what we already have. Gratitude is a powerful emotion that can not only uplift general well-being but when you combine it with journaling practice, we stand to gain greater perspective and resilience in life. The best way to express gratitude is through writing about the things, people, situations, events, etc., we are grateful for. The kids were educated on how to start writing gratitude in a journal.

- Pick a journal (any copy or diary we can create as per your ideas)
- Set out a day and time to write in the journal. If we miss a day here and there, don't beat yourself about it. Move on.
- Write the three things you are most thankful for.
- Imagine the feeling of gratitude while we write about the things you appreciate having in your life and let that emotion wash over you.
- Be expressive.
- Strive to make it a habit. The transformational effects of gratitude journaling take time to show.

The goal of this activity was the realization of people's contributions and their actions in one's life and how to acknowledge and appreciate them, which ultimately feel the importance of the relationship in our life. The session continued for two days.



Roll and Spin Coping Strategy

The Roll and Spin Coping activity was a fun game with planned events with life observation and experience expressions. The activity aimed to enhance communication, expression, recalling memories and correlating lifetime experiences. Through this game kids also develop the ability for quick response and memory retention.
